

# Habitat for Humanity receives Cape Cod 5 grant

**PLYMOUTH –** Habitat for Humanity of Greater Plymouth announced that Cape Cod 5, through its Foundation, has awarded the organization with a \$2,500 grant to support the construction of three affordable homes together on Long Pond Road in Plymouth.

The funds will be allocated to materials and infrastructure costs of the project, which is the largest in the affiliate's history.

HFHGP designated two of the three homes to military veterans in recognition of their service and sacrifice.

Foundations on all three homes have been poured and framing is currently underway on two of them. All of the families were selected earlier this spring, and they have begun work on the homes themselves, alongside dozens of volunteers every week.

In addition to the three Plymouth homes, a fourth home in Kingston is also being built now, with the exterior nearly complete. In the tradition of Habitat, construction labor is provided by volunteers.

Construction experience is not required and quali-

fied supervision is on-site to provide guidance and training. Volunteers must sign up in advance at <http://hfhplymouth.org>.
